

Extended to June 30, 2020

- Medical certificates that CDL holders need to submit provided that the CDL or CLP holders have proof of a valid medical certification that expired on or after March 1, 2020.
- Current CDLs and CLPs that expire during the COVID-19 emergency

Extended 120 Days

- Hazmat Endorsement

General Waiver

- A State may extend a CLP or CDL that would otherwise expire during the COVID-19 Emergency
- States may renew a CDL/CLP online
- Waives medical examination and certification, provided that they have proof of a valid medical certification that was issued for a period of 90 days or longer and that expired on or after March 1, 2020.

CLP Holders

- A CLP holder that passed a skills test, but is unable to complete their CDL application can continue to drive with the CLP.
 - An accompanied licensed driver is not required to be in the seat next to the person who has passed the CDL skills test but is required to be elsewhere in the vehicle. This does NOT apply for any of the endorsements (double/triples, passenger, tanker, hazmat and school bus).
 - The CLP holder must have in possession of evidence from the testing jurisdiction, including an authorized third-party tester, that the CLP holder has passed the CDL driving skills test, and, unless the FMCSA waiver issued on March 24, 2020 applies, that the CLP holder has a valid non-CDL driver's license, CLP, and medical certificate.
- Waives the requirement that CLP holders wait 14 days to take the CDL skills test.

Out of State Persons

A State may elect to administer a driving skills test to any out of state CDL applicant, regardless of where the applicant received driver training.

Credential Extensions from Other Jurisdictions

FMCSA recognizes the validity CDLs when jurisdictions issue a similar notice or declaration extending the validity date of the medical examination and certification and/or validity of the corresponding commercial driver's license due to interruption to government service resulting from COVID-19.
