<p><b>120 HOUR TRIP PERMIT</b></p> <p><b>Documentation:</b> Customer is not required to provide any documentation to obtain the permit. However, the vehicle must be currently registered in base jurisdiction at the same weight Requested on MN trip permit. 		<p><b>Notes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• USDOT number is not required to issue a fuel permit</li> <li>• Minnesota residents do not qualify for fuel permits; however the vehicle must have some form of valid Minnesota registration, such as a Minnesota issued trip permit or base plate, or Minnesota is listed as a jurisdiction on an out-of-state IRP (Prorate) registration. Note: You are NOT required to verify this information or view a cab card. Customer accepts the responsibility for operating legally while in Minnesota</li> <li>• There is no limit to the number of fuel permits that can be issued</li> <li>• Vehicles with a gross weight under 26,001 pounds do not need a fuel permit unless the power unit has three or more axles</li> <li>• There are no maximum weight limits on a Minnesota fuel permit</li> <li>• Exempt: Recreational and government owned vehicles</li> </ul>
<p><b>BASE PLATE PERMIT</b> (30, 60 or 90 days)</p> <p><b>Documentation:</b> Customer is not required to provide any documentation to obtain the permit.</p>	<p>Filing fee: \$11</p> <p>Registration tax is calculated by MNDRIIVE</p>	<p><b>Qualified Vehicle Requirements:</b></p> <p>A truck, truck tractor, or bus registered to an out-of-state resident with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Gross vehicle weight or registered gross vehicle weight exceeding 26,000 pounds or,</li> <li>• Three or more axles, regardless of gross weight or,</li> <li>• Used in combination when the gross weight of such combination exceeds 26,000 pounds gross weight</li> <li>• Base Plate may be issued at 26,000 pounds or less if the vehicle is involved in intrastate transportation in Minnesota</li> </ul> <p><b>Notes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minnesota residents do not qualify</li> <li>• Issued in 30, 60, or 90 day increments</li> <li>• There is no maximum weight limit on a base plate</li> <li>• A valid Interstate USDOT number is required. <p><b>TEMPORARY WEIGHT INCREASE PERMIT</b> (30, 60 OR 90 DAYS)</p> <p><i>Includes temporary weight increases due to seasonal harvests and frozen roads</i></p> <p><b>Documentation:</b> Customer is not required to provide any documentation to obtain the permit.</p>	<p>Filing Fee: \$11</p> <p>Registration Tax is calculated by MNDRIIVE</p>	<p><b>Qualified Vehicle Requirements:</b></p> <p><u>Minnesota Residents</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Applies to trucks or truck-tractors with current Minnesota registration, including IRP Registration – verify record</li> <li>• Current registration must be at 80,000 pounds or more</li> <li>• A valid Intrastate or Interstate USDOT number is required. To verify, visit <a href="http://www.safersys.org/CompanySnapshot.aspx">http://www.safersys.org/CompanySnapshot.aspx</a> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Vehicles registered in the farm class are exempt from a USDOT number unless the vehicle is involved in interstate movement (crosses state lines or delivers produce to a sea or river port)</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p><u>Out-of-State Residents</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Some form of valid Minnesota registration at a minimum of 80,000 pounds, such as a Minnesota issued trip permit or base plate, or Minnesota is listed as a jurisdiction on an out-of-state IRP (Prorate) registration</li> <li>• A valid Interstate USDOT number is required.. <p><b>120 HOUR UNLADEN WEIGHT HUNTER'S PERMIT</b></p> <p><b>Documentation:</b> Customer is not required to provide any documentation to obtain the permit.</p> <p>Only 1 permit allowed</p>	<p>Reg Tax: None</p> <p>Filing Fee: \$11</p>	<p><b>Qualified Vehicle Requirements:</b></p> <p>The permit allows the owner/operator of a vehicle previously leased to a motor carrier to legally operate the vehicle at the vehicle's empty (unladen) weight while hunting for another job or to return home.</p> <p>To Qualify:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The most recent registration displayed on vehicle must be a Minnesota IRP license plate</li> <li>• The Minnesota IRP plate must have been returned to the carrier at the termination of a lease</li> </ul> <p><b>Notes:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Minnesota prorate IRP plates must be currently</li> </ul>

		<p>registered to the vehicle or have been deleted from the Minnesota prorate account within 14 days of making application for the hunters permit</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Vehicle cannot haul a load with this permit, it can only be operated at the vehicle's empty (unladen) weight</li> <li>• A USDOT number is not required to issue permit</li> <li>• A Minnesota temporary fuel permit is not required. However, an out-of-state fuel permit may be required if traveling out-of-state, unless the vehicle is covered by a current IFTA license, existing fuel permit or fuel reciprocity agreement</li> </ul>
